Roma women face intersectional challenges

Women in general often meet obstacles when seeking access to justice when subject to gender-based and domestic violence, and women facing intersectional discrimination can meet even more obstacles. Roma women and girls are among the most vulnerable groups within and across European states. They face multi-dimensional discrimination and intersectional challenges, are often socially marginalised and frequently economically disadvantaged.

The situation of Roma women requires specific and equitable measures to ensure their access to justice when subject to gender-based and domestic violence.

The event will present challenges and identify best practices in the following 4 areas:

1. Participation of Roma women and relevant NGO representatives in the development, implementation, monitoring and evaluation of programmes and projects.
2. Prevention of violence against women within Roma communities.
3. Protection of Roma women victims of domestic violence from further violence, and support of Roma women to overcome the multiple consequences of such violence, allowing them to rebuild their lives.
4. Prosecution of perpetrators of violence against Roma women.
